

Guidelines and Rules for Regulating the Racket Run in the Ice Park of the SAP Garden

The racket run is primarily designed to provide children, teenagers, and adults the opportunity to practice ice hockey outside of organized sports, meaning outside of clubs. With this clear objective, it is also evident that the focus of the racket run is on fun, enjoyment, and camaraderie, rather than serving as a traditional training game or competition.

The priority is always to avoid injuries and damages. Therefore, the following rules apply:

- There is a requirement for mutual consideration, especially towards children.
- Participation in the racket run is at one's own responsibility and risk.
- A minimum age of 10 years is recommended for participation, as the teams will be diverse.
- The following actions are prohibited (attempting these may also lead to exclusion):
 - Slap shots
 - High shots and passes
 - (Body) checks or checking
- Instructions and guidelines from supervisory personnel must be followed without exception. Non-compliance with the instructions or rules of the racket run may result in immediate expulsion or even a ban from the premises. In this case, the admission fee will not be refunded.

Requirements for participation in the racket run:

Equipment: During the so-called "racket run," each participant is responsible for ensuring they have adequate protective clothing:

- Ice skates – these are essential but can be rented at the SAP Garden.
- Important: A stick, ice hockey helmet (with cage or full visor), and gloves are mandatory.
- The wearing of additional protective gear, especially shin guards and elbow pads, is strongly recommended and is the responsibility of the respective participant or their legal guardians.
- In the event of a violation of the mandatory requirements, the supervisory personnel are authorized to immediately expel the individual from the ice. This will also nullify their right to participate in the racket run, and the admission fee will not be refunded.

Important: No liability is accepted for injuries resulting from the absence of or improper use of protective clothing.

Ice Skating Regulations and Ticketing Terms and Conditions at SAP Garden

Reference is hereby made to the valid ice skating regulations and the terms and conditions of ticketing for the SAP Garden. These particularly apply to the racket run. The currently valid ice skating regulations can be viewed online on the SAP Garden's website and are also posted on display. By purchasing a ticket, the participating individual agrees to the aforementioned guidelines, the ticketing terms and conditions, as well as the house rules of the SAP Garden.

The racket run is offered within the framework of public skating; therefore, the corresponding admission prices apply. The ticket quota is limited.
