

SAP Garden Ice Skating Regulations Summer Ice*

Art. 1 Purpose

- These ice skating regulations of Red Bull Stadion München GmbH ("RBSM") serve to ensure safety, order and cleanliness in the SAP Garden. It is binding for all visitors in the context of public ice skating (which includes, in particular: public ice skating, disco and evening skating, free skating, ice dance adults, figure skating adults, racquet skating, curling).
- Access to the public ice skating is only granted upon presentation of a valid ticket. With the purchase of a ticket for the public ice skating, the provisions of these ice skating regulations as well as arena regulations for the SAP Garden in the current version are accepted. Both regulations are posted at the entrance to the public ice rink and can be viewed on the SAP Garden homepage.
- Any use that deviates from the provisions of these ice skating regulations and the arena regulations for the SAP Garden requires a separate agreement (at least in text form).

Art. 2 Restriction of use

- For kids and juveniles up to 16 years the following restrictions apply:

a) During the daytime periods, children **under the age of 6** may only skate if accompanied by a person with parental authority or authorized guardian; during the public evening hours, they may not use the SAP-Garden.

b) **Children from 6 to 13 years of age** may only skate during the public evening hours (running hours from 7 p.m.) if accompanied by a person with parental authority or authorized guardian of at least 18 years.

c) **Young people from 14 to 16 years of age** are allowed to skate until 10 p.m.

The obligation to examine and provide evidence pursuant to § 2 Protection of Young Persons Act ("JuSchG") must be complied with on request.

- Persons who require care due to their physical condition are only permitted to use it with suitable accompanying persons. Blind and Significant Physically disabled persons must be accompanied by a person over 16 years of age.
- Persons without sports equipment who are not persons with parental authority or are not authorized guardians pursuant to subsection (1) or accompanying persons pursuant to subsection (2) shall not have access to public evening skating during the public evening ice skating (from 7 p.m.).
- Entry to public ice skating may be denied to individuals or they may be expelled from the premises without refund if they:
 - refuse to consent to control measures,
 - do not follow the instructions of the supervisory staff to enforce the domiciliary rights,
 - are visibly under the influence of alcohol or drugs,
 - are recognisably prone to violence or are prepared to incite acts of violence,
 - Have a discernible intent to disrupt the event or operation of the SAP Garden,
 - carry prohibited items according to the arena regulations (in the case of public ice skating, the exception for babies and toddlers in section 6.1 letter n) also extends to children),
 - in which there is a suspicion of contagious diseases within the meaning of Federal Epidemics Act (Bundesseuchenschutzgesetz), the Infection Protection Act (Infektionsschutzgesetz) or similar diseases that endanger safety,
 - where there is a local or nationwide stadium/house ban,
 - where official requirements or other security reasons prevent access or remaining.

Art. 3 Tickets

- The admission ticket must be kept after access and shown on request.
- In the case of discounted tickets, the current - if available: official proof or verification of discount must be presented at the time of purchase, carried with you during the visit and shown at the request of the supervisory staff. If it is not carried or is not valid, access may be denied or excluded from public skating. In these cases, there is no entitlement to a refund of the entrance fee or to compensation. Violations can be punished with a criminal complaint.
- Visitors who are found without a valid admission ticket are obliged to pay a flat-rate usage fee, without prejudice to Section 2. This amounts to

a) up to and including 16 years: 30,00 €

b) from 17 years: 60,00€.

Art. 4 Hours

- The operating hours are determined by the RBSM and announced on the notice /homepage of the SAP Garden.
- In the event of overcrowding, unavoidable or unforeseen events, the duration of use may be temporarily shortened or the public ice skating may be partially or completely discontinued. In the event of a temporary reduction, there is no entitlement to a refund of the entrance fee. No compensation will be provided in the event of the cancellation of the public ice skating, unless the interruption covers the significant part of the ice skating time and is the responsibility of RBSM.
- In the event of a complete cancellation of the public ice skating, the entrance fee will be refunded on request.

Art. 5 Conduct in the SAP Garden

- Visitors must behave in such a way that no other person is endangered, harmed or hindered or harassed more than is unavoidable under the circumstances. Everyone must follow the instructions of the forces of order, in particular the police, the fire brigade and the event manager. Announcements must always be observed and the instructions must be followed.
- Without prejudice to paragraphs 5 and 6 of the house rules of the SAP-Garden, the following are not permitted in public ice skating:
 - smoking, including the use of e-cigarettes;
 - skipping the access system (e.g. group door) or otherwise providing unauthorised access (e.g. by keeping the group door open);
 - speed skating, chain skating, figure skating and jumping figures as well as running against the general running direction; this includes jumps and spins, as well as other figure skating elements - the blade of the skate may only be lifted off the ice up to knee height.
 - Catch games, snowball throwing, hook tearing;
 - group dances, e.g. dipferl dance;
 - Sitting on the edge of the ice rink and climbing over the boards;
 - Make a noise;
 - Bringing and/or using sound reproduction equipment.;
 - contamination of floors, ice surfaces, toilets and other premises;
 - Bringing animals;
 - Any commercial activity, including the provision of skating lessons, unless expressly authorised by RBSM;
 - Use of high-speed skates during public ice skating;
 - throwing objects on the ice surface;
 - Setting off fireworks or shooting flares;
 - Taking wheelchairs, prams and the like onto the ice rinks;
 - Bringing and/or consuming alcohol. Drinks;
 - Use of the grandstand with skates, with the exception of the designated areas with floor protection mats
 - Freestyle ice skating, jumping over people lying on the ground, lifting feet in the air and spinning circles with your hands on the ground;
 - the operation of drones.
 - Entering the ice surfaces before the fixed ice running time or during preparation
- The supervisory staff is authorized to expel persons from the SAP Garden who:
 - endanger security, peace and order, or
 - harass other people, or
 - seriously or despite a warning, they again violate the provisions of the ice skating regulations.

Criminal charges are reserved. In addition, access can be prohibited for a limited period of time or permanently.

- In case of expulsion from the SAP Garden, the entrance fee will not be refunded.
- Intentionally caused damage or contamination obliges you to compensate for the property damage or to reimburse the cleaning costs. In addition, criminal prosecution is reserved.
- The SAP Garden is under video surveillance.

- The prohibitions of numbers 2 c) and 2 e) do not apply to free skating, ice dance adults and figure skating adults.
- For the racket skating the regulations of the SAP Garden Racket Run Regulations must also be observed.

Art. 6 Changing and storage facilities

- The provisions of the arena regulations for the SAP Garden apply.
- It is expressly advised not to take any valuables into the SAP Garden. RBSM does not assume any guarding or duties of care for any amounts of money or valuables that are nevertheless brought along.
- The placing of money or valuables in a storage device does not create any obligations on the part of RBSM in relation to the items brought in. In particular, no custody obligations are established. When using a storage device, it is the sole responsibility of the visitor to properly lock it, to check the secure locking of the respective device and to ensure the safe storage of the key at all times during use/visit.

Art. 7 Found objects

Lost property must be handed over to the HelpDesk/Service Point at E8 in the SAP Garden. They are kept there for 4 weeks and then forwarded to the lost property office of the City of Munich as the responsible authority.

Art. 8 Liability

- Visitors to the public ice skating rink use the SAP Garden at their own risk, without prejudice to the obligation to keep it in a traffic-safe condition.
- RBSM and its vicarious agents are only liable for intentional or grossly negligent acts, except in the case of injury to life, limb and health as well as the violation of essential contractual obligations.
- Complaints about defects or contamination of the facilities or installations must be submitted to the supervisory staff immediately. In the event of damage, subsequent complaints cannot be taken into account.

Art. 10 Place of jurisdiction

The place of jurisdiction is Munich.
